## 1 Břevnov Monastery

The monastery of Břevnov is the oldest male monastery in Czechia. It was founded in 993 by prince Boleslav II and Prague bishop Vojtěch. The grounds of the monastery together with the garden belong among the national cultural monuments. Let yourself be impressed by the atmosphere of this exceptional place, while you walk in the monastery garden. We also recommend a guided tour of the interiors, during which you will see the Basilica of St. Margaret, the crypt from the 11th century and the prelature with the Teresian Hall. Please note that the monastery is not barrier-free accessible.

## 2 Villa Müller and Villa Rothmayer

Discover two exceptional villas in Prague 6 which are definitely worth your attention. Prominent construction entrepreneur František Müller had the Villa Müller built between 1928 and 1930. The author of this gem of the world's modern architecture was none other than Adolf Loos, who created its design in cooperation with Karel Lhota. The interior of Villa Müller represents a luxurious residence reminiscent of the First Republic lifestyle of the family that rightfully belonged to the upper circles of Prague society.

Villa Rothmayer was built at the same time. The architect Otto Rothmayer, who had it built, lived here with his wife and son. Apart from family home, the villa also served as a centre of cultural life, where family friends spent time. For example, photographer Josef Sudek or glassmaker René Roubíček, whose works decorate the garden. Today, the villa is one of the important monuments of Czech interwar architecture, and thanks to the preservation of the house, interiors and gardens, it is also a unique testimony to the working environment, intellectual background and lifestyle of the Rothmayer family.



### Our tip

You can visit each villa separately, but it is more convenient to buy a joint ticket to both of these wonderful houses. The villas do not have barrier-free access.

### 3 Dancing House Roof

The Dancing House is one of Prague's iconic buildings. The 1996 building is inspired by the famous interwar dancing couple, Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers. The female dancer is symbolized by the glass tower, the male dancer by the stone one. There is a hotel with a café, a restaurant and a magical 360° roof terrace in the Dancing House. Enjoy a unique panoramic view of Prague.



#### Our tip

A gallery, located on the ground floor and basement, is also part of the Dancing House. Walk through the important building literally from the basement to the roof.

#### 4 Sacre Coeur Park

Even Prague has its Sacre Coeur! Explore the chapel built in the Neo-Gothic style, decorated with wall paintings by Beroun artists. You can enjoy the chapel not only as a work of art, but you can even get married here, above Prague! In addition to the chapel, you can also enjoy the peace and view of the historic centre in the adjacent park, where you will find not only quiet corners full of trees and bushes, but also flowery meadows, perfect for a picnic. Experience Paris in Prague.

## 5 Prague ferries and sightseeing cruises

You can move around Prague on foot or use public transport. Metro, trams, buses, but also boats. The ferries are part of Prague integrated transport, so you will only need a ticket that you use in public transport. If you want to enjoy the historic centre from a different perspective, we recommend the Prague Venice (Pražské Benátky) sightseeing cruise. You will get to know the mysterious water underground of old Prague and the unique panoramas of the hundred-spired city. Whether you choose to sail through Prague's Venice or use the ferry to cross the Vltava river, there will be no shortage of magical views.

Some of the ferries operate year-round, others are only seasonal. We recommend to check the timetable on the Prague integrated transport website before your trip.

## 6 Gardens of Prague Castle

The Prague Castle is one of the most significant landmarks of the capital. In addition to the ancient architecture, it also boasts beautiful gardens that are available all year round. Wander through their nooks and crannies, admire the views and visit the Empire Greenhouse, the Orangery, the St. Wenceslas Vineyard and the Garden of Eden. Don't forget the Stag Moat or the terrace of the Riding School, where concerts and other cultural events are held. No matter where you go within the Prague Castle, you will see beautiful places.

There is a beautiful view of Prague from the Hradčany Square (Hradčanské náměstí). You can find hidden exhibition spaces of the National Gallery in the nearby palaces, and the Kuchyň restaurant is a perfect place for your lunch.

## 7 Pilsner Urquell Experience exhibition

The Czech Republic is a beer empire. The most famous beer is undoubtedly the Pilsner beer – but do you really know it? During the tour, the recently opened Pilsner Urquell Experience exhibition introduces you to the history of the first Pilsner Urquell golden lager, which revolutionized brewing 180 years ago. As part of the route, an audio guide, video mapping, a light show and a projection await you, which will explain to you how the first pilsner-type beer was created. A tasting is also a matter of course.

Get to know beer not only theoretically, but also practically. In the tapping school, you will be taught how to tap a flat top (“hladinka”), a Snyt (“šnyt”) or the creamy “mlíko”, and you will try out the profession of a beer bartender.

### 3 Na Marjance

The history of the Břevnov building Na Marjance began to be written in 1808, when it served as a coaching inn. It got its name after the innkeeper Marie, who was known for her kindness. Over the years, several businesses have changed here: a hotel, a bar, a buffet, a butcher's shop and later a dance hall. During the Second World War, the building was used as a coal warehouse, after 1949 it passed into public ownership, only to be returned to the original owners in 1991. After a complete reconstruction, it is again used for its original purposes and today the Na Marjance restaurant is located here. Choose from the daily or weekend menu and enjoy great gastronomy in a magical space.

## 1 Farmers' markets of “Kulaťák” and “Náplavka”

These belong among the largest in the Czech Republic, and offer good quality food, fresh vegetables and fruit or flowers, as well as original design pieces.

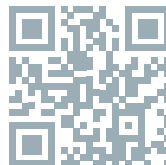




### 3 Discover the city

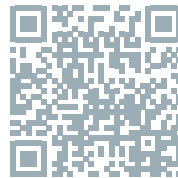
